Prevention Program

The Prison Prevention Ministries program provides an experiential opportunity for your child to see, taste, smell, feel and hear what life behind bars is tangibly like. This experience alone can prevent many youth from taking a wrong path in life. We hope you will see the PPM Prevention Program as one more tool or resource toward the success of your child.

There are four basic areas of the Prevention Program:

- **Presentations:** Youth will have the opportunity to hear real life experiences from those who have made poor decisions and suffered their consequences. The presentations illustrate the significance of choices even at an early age.
- **Prison Tours:** Youth will tour a medium/maximum-security prison. It is not intended to scare, but rather educate on the reality of poor decision-making. Prevention and facility staff will conduct the guided tour. Youth may have the chance to hear stories from inmates and visit the cafeteria, recreation yards, dormitories, as well as lock-down units. Youth will also see career opportunities within the Department of Corrections. Each institution will determine what the tour group will see upon arrival.
- **Group Follow Up and 1-on-1 Follow Up:** PPM staff will hold a group debrief following the tour. PPM staff may also visit with the youth 1-on-1 for relationship and character building. The staff will offer strategic tools to encourage the youth to move towards positive goals for the future.
- **Referral Program:** We believe long-term relationships change lives through connection and accountability. Youth may be referred to other organizations within the community to reinforce positive decision making.

FACILITY TOUR RELEASE AGREEMENT

I, _____, hereby request by this Facility Tour Release Agreement ("Release") to be allowed to tour Silverdale Correctional Facility located at 7609 Standifer Gap Road, Chattanooga, TN 37422 ("Facility"), which is currently operated by Corrections Corporation of America ("CCA"). I acknowledge that my visit is totally voluntary and understand that a tour of a correctional facility carries inherent risks which I knowingly and willingly assume. CCA has made no representation to me about the suitability or safety of any such tour and neither CCA, nor any employee of CCA, shall be responsible for coming to my aid in the event of an emergency, accident or incident during the tour. On behalf of myself and any and all heirs, successors and assigns, I hereby release CCA, and any and all CCA employees and representatives from all liability for injury to me regardless of the nature, manner or severity of the injury, including death, and for any and all property damage sustained by me while on the Facility premises. By signing this release I am acknowledging: (1) that I have read this Release in its entirety and fully understand the terms and consequences, (2) that a correctional facility tour by its nature is a potentially hazardous activity that has inherent risks, (3) that all personal property of any kind belonging to me that I bring onto the Facility premises in connection with the tour shall be at my sole risk and expense, and that CCA, its employees, and representatives shall not be liable for loss or damage to such property, and (4) that I expressly assume any and all dangers, risks, and hazards arising from my presence at the Facility during such tour, whether or not explicitly set forth herein. I further agree to fully comply with the Tour Guidelines attached hereto as Exhibit A.

EXHIBIT A

TOUR GUIDELINES

1. It is imperative that all tour groups arrive at the Facility twenty minutes earlier than the time scheduled for the tour. CCA maintains the right to cancel a tour if participants arrive late.
2. All participants, regardless of age, must present a signed Release to security staff upon their arrival at the Facility. Persons who fail to comply with this requirement will not be admitted into the Facility.
3. No handbags, fanny packs, backpacks or similar items are allowed in the Facility.
4. Tour participants must comply with the Facility dress code:
 - Shorts are not allowed
 - Skirts/dresses must be no shorter than 2" above the knee
 - White T-shirts are not allowed
 - No obscene, suggestive or political printing on clothing
 - No open toe shoes/sandals are permitted.
 - All items of clothing must be worn appropriately on the body
 - Earrings will not be worn by any tour participants
 - Hats will not be worn inside the Facility.
5. A picture ID will be required of each participant
6. Tour participants will not be allowed to carry anything into the Facility. It is recommended that jewelry be left at home or locked in the person's vehicle.
7. Vehicles must be secured while on the Facility grounds. Doors must be locked; windows must be closed; keys must be removed from the vehicle and secured at the Visitation Control Room inside the institution. Valuables must not be visible to persons walking by the vehicles.
8. No cameras or recording devices are allowed.
9. Persons who display an inappropriate attitude toward Facility staff will be immediately removed from the Facility and will vacate the premises.
